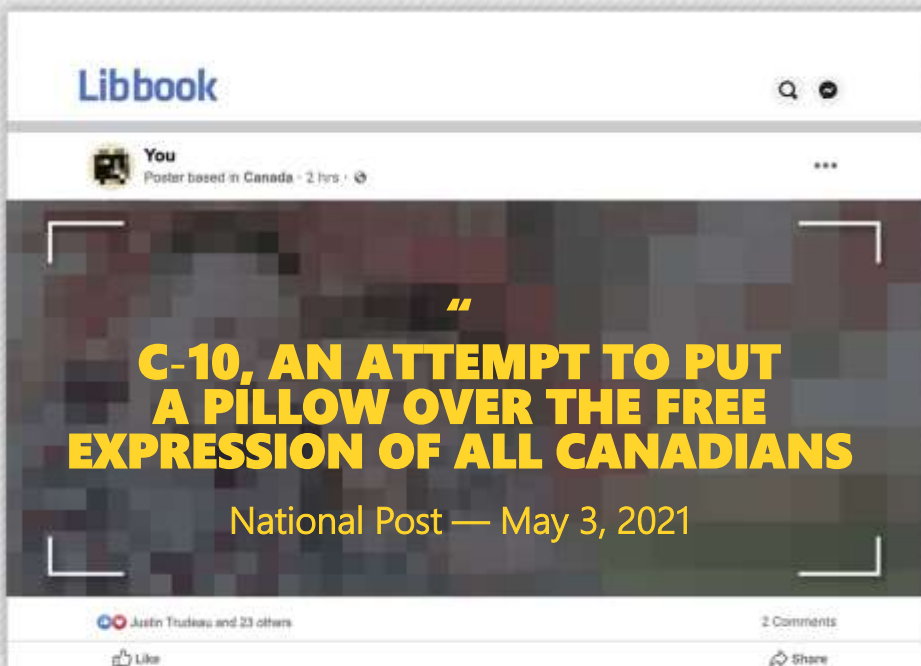
Conservatives are the only ones in Parliament opposing Bill C-10.

YOUR SOCIAL MEDIA POSTS MAY SOON COME UNDER GOVERNMENT REGULATION.

Conservative MPs are fighting
to protect your free speech.

Changes to Bill C-10 — made at the behest of Liberal MPs on Parliament’s heritage committee — would allow the Canadian Radio-television and Telecommunications Commission (CRTC) to regulate user-generated content uploaded to social media platforms, much as it regulates radio and TV content now. Concerningly, the Liberals have offered no clear guidelines for how this power will be used.

It’s not just Conservatives who are concerned. University of Ottawa law professor Michael Geist says the Liberals are now “the most anti-Internet government in Canadian history.”
